- 1. Entries are limited to one per builder.
- Models must remain on display until 3 p.m. on Sunday, March 21<sup>st</sup>.
- 3. All models except RC sailplanes must have motors or engines. All models must have connected radio systems and servos.
- 4. Model registration is open on Friday, March 19<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m. until 7 p.m. Additional setup time is available on Saturday, March 20 from 7:30 a.m. to 9 a.m. If you need to bring your plane on Saturday, please email brianv@airage.com.
- 5. Entries are free, and each entrant will be given one (1) free, two-day pass to the show.
- 6. We reserve the right to move aircraft models as necessary to make room for all competitors.
- 7. Competitors are encouraged to provide documentation plaques with their models as well as photos, providing they fit in their respective display space.
- 8. It is recommended that chocks be included with your model to prevent them from rolling while on display.



that burn real jet fuel. Today as scale modelers we pursue nearly with the confidence that not only that it may out perform that of its scale counterpart.


