

# Tim Cardin's update on the Ortego FW-190 It FLIES!

The Ortego FW-190 is a looker and a crowd pleaser. Even the exhaust stacks for the engine are in the right spot!



Tim Puts IN the extra effort making this project lightning fast from kit-in-thebox to dream-come-true at the field with detailing and flight performance that is simply IMPRESSIVE.



All,

Here are the specifics. Build Time 14 Weeks

Kit: Jerry Ortego models FW 190 A4 Which I was given as the Commanders' Award at the Scale Squadron Jerry Ortego Memorial Fun Fly in June 2010. I'm not sure of the kits age but the glass had yellowed as well as the canopy which was wrapped in news paper dated March 1981. Fiberglass fuselage and cowl, balsa sheeted foam wing, horizontal and vertical stab all glassed with <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz cloth and West Systems epoxy resin. Ailerons, elevator and rudder covered with Coverite.

Engine; O.S. Gemini II 120 fitted with dual carburetors and modified by Bill Vanleuwen, custom exhaust exiting in scale locations with an APC 15x8

Radio: Airtronics SD-10G 2.4Ghz FHSS3, 10 Ch rx, all digital servos. 94820 servos on the ailerons and flaps, 94772 on rudder/tail wheel duty and 94722 everywhere else all provided by Airtronics

Power: 2SP Lipo 2200 MA with a 6v 10amp regulator

Weight: Slightly less than 13lbs

Retracts: Robart air up/spring down provided by Mike Greenshields modified to operate @ approximately 80 degrees running 130psi

Tail wheel: Robart small mechanical retractable (modified) using pull-pull cables

Main Gear: Oleo struts built by me

Color Scheme: Winter camouflage as campaigned by Jerry Ortego in his honor

Paint: Top Flight for primer and color, finished with Top Flight flat clear.

Number and Markings: all made by using a combination of paint, trim Monokote, Photoshop and a color printer.

Documentation: Jerry's original documentation graciously provided by Phyllis Ortego, additional FW 190 documentation provided by Gordy Truax and Larry Wright

Start to finish this was a really fun project. I did all the work myself but had the support of the Scale Squadron all the way and kept everyone up to date by bringing it to the meetings for show n' tell.

On a personal note, I've been having a BLAST building with Larry Wolfe on the Panther and other projects. Tim mentioned this in his letter. I'm going to repeat it...






