



BLAST FROM THE PAST- Model Airplane News Article about The Scale Squadron from April 1979

MODEL AIRPLANE NEWS APRIL 1979

"California's scale contests seem to be the trend-setters for the rest of the country. Last year the first West Coast "Uncontest" drew over a hundred participants. The group responsible for such advanced thinking is the Southern California Scale Squadron.

This small group has already trained it's own static judges and founded AT-6 scale racing, in just a little over a year as a club. With all these feathers in their caps is it any wonder that the Scale Squadron's 4th Annual Contest was a major event

Typical sun-drenched and cloudless skies prevailed at Mile Square Recreational Facility during the big weekend. The contest site would make any modeler drool, with runways at least a quarter of a mile long. A complete park with ponds and barbeques is nestled along the perimeter of the flying field.

Heaven, you say? Even the brightest diamond has a flaw, and this superb facility unfortunately is only a stone's throw from a golf course, i.e., a strict 83 db muffler rule is enforced.

This near-idyllic setting frames a scale contest unlike any other, for the Scale Squadron's affairs seem to exude a certain atmosphere that makes it good "vibes" for contestants and spectators alike. On the other hand, there's some tough competition, with some of the finest builders and fliers imaginable; yet the tenor is casual and at-ease, so you almost feel as if you're at a fun fly.

One feature that contributed to the informal atmosphere was that the members of the host club seemed as if they were on vacation—no one seemed to be doing much of anything! Surprisingly, every contestant was registered, judged and ready to fly on time...the Scale Squadron members were just cruising through a very well rehearsed scenario. Everyone knew his job and did it.

The judging team performed flawlessly, under the watchful eyes of Noel Allison. Each plane was static scored in less than ten minutes. With 52 planes registered, such uniform judging made the training worthwhile.

Sport Scale, with 33 entries, dominated the weekend. Two veterans were on hand, with perennial winner John Lockwood defending California's honor against Arizona's Kent Walters.

By the end of Saturday's flying, trophies were teeter-tottering among a half dozen hopefuls.. Granger Williams, Martin Baker, Joe Zdankiewics, Bob Frey, Mas Taota, George Kelleen, Larry Wolfe, Buzz Watson and Dennis Osborn.

The entire contest continued the trend setting ways of the Southern California Scale Squadron, as it reinforced the high level of planning skill and dedication that made this 4th Annual Contest a successful event. Next year's big fete is already in the planning stages, and there's some talk of changing the name to the Western Scale Nationals. No matter what the name, the Squadron will guarantee that this is one weekend of scale flying you won't want to miss."
